

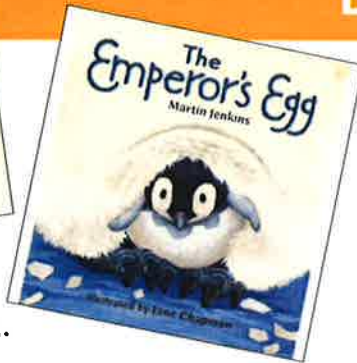
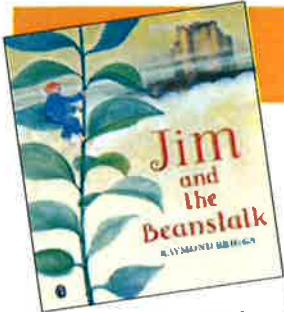

Literacy...



These are our main books for this half term.

 * In literacy, we are looking at traditional tales. You may want *
 * to take your child to the local library to look for and read *
 * traditional tales such as Hansel and Gretel. Once you have *
 * read a story with your child ask them to retell the story in *
 * their own words. If you have any traditional stories in your *
 * own culture, please share them with your child so that they *
 * can discuss them with their teacher or friends in class. *

Maths...

 * Help your child to count *
 * forwards in 2s, 5s and 10s, at *
 * first starting from 0. *
 * Once secure, can they start *
 * from any number *
 * (For example, 1, 3, 5, 7... *
 * or *
 * 12, 17, 22, 27... *
 * or even backwards! *
 * 51, 41, 31, 21...) *
 * *****

 * Your child will be looking at *
 * multiplication (x) this term. *
 * Support their learning by *
 * playing games with plates and *
 * beans. For example, 5 x 3 would *
 * be 5 plates with 3 beans on each, *
 * making a total of 15 beans. Once *
 * secure, they can start to learn *
 * simple times tables. *
 * *****

 * Encourage your child to *
 * pay for small items in the *
 * local shop, helping them to *
 * work out the total cost. *
 * Can they work out which *
 * coins to use, or how much *
 * change to expect from *
 * 20p, 50p or £1? *

Science and topic work...

In Science we will be looking at everyday materials. We will be investigating why different materials are suited for different purposes. Talk to your child about objects in your house that are made from different materials and discuss why. For example, why are forks made from metal not wood? Why are windows made from glass and not paper?

- The children are excited about their educational visit to cross the river on the Emirates Air Line.
- This is part of their Geography learning, helping them to understand the concept of an aerial view and how this relates to maps. They will be extending their geographical vocabulary through first hand experience of the river, ships, piers, harbours and airports they see.



- In history, we will be learning about significant people and events from the past. For example, we will study Remembrance Day and why people wear poppies. We will explore how and why people commemorate it on the 11th of November every year.

As you are aware children have been bringing two books home every week. Enjoy the books with your child and make sure that they are returned regularly in good condition.
