Dear Parents & Carers,

What should my child expect from immediate remote education in the first day or two of pupils being sent home?

Teachers will start remote learning immediately. It will be a combination of lessons conducted on Zoom and pupils accessing Bug Club phonics, Bug Club reading and Abacas maths. Teachers will register children daily.

Following the first few days of remote education, will my child be taught broadly the same curriculum as they would if they were in school?

We teach the same curriculum remotely as we do in school wherever possible and appropriate. However, we have needed to make some adaptations in some subjects. For example, some lessons that need concrete resources such as maths we will be using online tools and may also require children to access (if possible) some physical tools (objects for counting etc.).

Remote teaching and study time each day

How long can I expect work set by the school to take my child each day?

We expect that remote education (including remote teaching and independent work) will take pupils broadly the following number of hours each day:

We expect parents and carers to ensure that children fully access their learning, complete any work that is set. For Nursery through to year 2 children should access a minimum of 3 hours of learning per day.
